

Carmarthen and District Harriers Committee Meeting – Ivy Bush Hotel – Carmarthen Wednesday 20th September 2017 19:00-22:00

The minutes of meeting held on 24th May 2017 were checked for accuracy. In agreement, the minutes were accepted as a true record.

Minutes arising from the meeting:

- Carmarthen Harriers Dinner 2017
- Replies have been slow to come in so far (just the 15 at the time of writing) More should be sent quicker when award letters have gone out. The dinner is held on Friday 3rd November at the Ivy Bush Hotel in Carmarthen with Dewi Griffiths as the guest speaker.
- Thursday night training was reported as going well with a good small group of around 12-15 attending weekly. These sessions are only through invite to those who compete for the club.
- Track condition: will need resurfacing as some places are starting to go. The track might undergo relining next year but this will have to go through a process as the cost is likely to be around £200,000. April-July period would be good as the weather will be better.
- The high jump and pole vault is in bad shape. Pole Vault stands are a problem. Dave Jessett is invited down to the track ahead of the track season to inspect the venue.
- **Action**: Looking at facilities and submitting a report to the county council. Also, it was would be useful to consult with the HJ & PV coaches along with Sarah Jones and the Leisure Centre.
- There were problems with the relining of javelin and discus sector lines throughout the summer, as they were going over the incorrect football lines. The council was contacted several times ahead of the upcoming events. A course could perhaps be arranged that someone knows how to mark out. Andrew can check any options in relation to the javelin/discus/hammer lines.

Network Officer

- Rebecca Gatt left in January and it has taken around six months for a new person to come in. Andrew Lloyd-Hughes is now the new Dyfed Network Officer.
- It was pointed out that a track certification high level would be needed for hosting bigger events which would require a level 3, the club currently has level 1. Action: An assessment to take place to put corrections in place before.
- Carmarthenshire Primary Schools Cross Country: Taking place on Thursday 21^{st} September at the Showground. The Highway agency met with event volunteers over car parking and traffic control. A new system is in place for 2017 with 17 marshals and radio equipment used.

Gwent League:

- A good event back in March, and the venue will be used again in December. The Welsh Road Relay Championships was also a success during September. Thanks were given to Neil Thomas for the main organization of the championships along with others who contributed. It was positive to see local athletes supporting their home events and many seniors commented on the encouraging course and quality. It is hoped that the event will come back again, the question being would it be March or September?

Catering

- Thanks to Edward and his volunteers for their help during the summer season.

 A profit of £1100 was made and worked well. Athletes not involved in the
 Louise Arthur League etc were present to help on the stand outside the shed.
- Dyfed Schools in June: Event called off during the morning due to poor weather conditions.
- No invoice as yet from St John Ambulance. This will be received at the end of the month.

- Australian athletes:

- 3 athletes turned up in June along with a mother and Neville Sillitoe. Due to the cancellation of the schools, they joined up with club members to train on the track on Saturday afternoon and Pembrey.

Use of football games in centre of the athletics track

- It is a school pitch; however there was a meeting with the area manager about strict rules about playing games on the field. A Carmarthen senior and team have agreed to a limit of 8 games but if pitch is unsuitable then they do not use. They bring their own equipment on the day. The drainage on the field is not great.

- Have been arranged by Alison. All coaches and team managers/officers have one now and looks good particularly out at events, with good comments coming especially at the Louise Arthur in Swansea, where the club colors were obvious to see.

- No further progress. The club does have a notice board inside the leisure centre, however it is situated at the further end near the old entrance. Action: Jake to enquire moving the board closer to where visitors can see.

70th Welsh schools national athletics championships

Dyfed schools again had a good team and individual result at the championship at Cardiff

Dyfed won the overall team title once again, the twenty fourth time since 1989 (Cardiff and Vale schools are the only other district to have won the Charlie Hughes Trophy in that period). They beat Dyfed into second place in 1996, 2007, 2009 and 2014

80 athletes competed for Dyfed at Cardiff and this year the Dyfed team was up against a very strong Cardiff and Vale team, a home match for them, Afan Nedd Tawe and five other Welsh school districts

This year the Dyfed schools championships on Saturday 10 June 2017 had to be cancelled on the due to the heavy rain that started at 8am and it rained all day. Selection of the Dyfed schools was a problem this year

This year Dyfed schools were not expected to win as Afan Nedd Tawe (Swansea and Neath/Port Talbot) were the favourites closely followed by a very strong Cardiff and Vale schools team. Both these school districts have a concentrated population and excellent training and competition facilities

Dyfed were behind the Afan Nedd Tawe schools team for most of the day but came through strongly to win by 17.5 points.

Coaching/Committee Report

Jane Batten prepared a coaching report for the meeting.

The outdoor athletics season has come to an end with reasonable results in the LA league. The coordination between our volunteers who coordinate, organize, coax and cajole, officiate and coach is very good within the club and, in my opinion, we have a very strong team of volunteers working together at the moment. Many thanks to everyone involved for your time and hard work, it is much appreciated. The main difficulty with Tuesday night training is the number of children who come with no intention of competing. Some of them have trained every week throughout the summer, but have not competed at all. These athletes are holding the competitive athletes back, as we do not have enough coaches to split groups into

smaller sizes and event specific training. This has been addressed by Jake and Neil who have provided Thursday night training for the competitive U11 and U13 competitive athletes, which has been very successful, proving by results. The conclusion is that smaller, competitive group training is effective, but does increase the burden on coaches and relies on coaches giving up more time. Personally, the Thursday night groups make coaching worthwhile, as it is much more of a coaching challenge and more rewarding.

Ralph has met with the new WA Clubs coordinator for our region to discuss the possibility of National coaches coming to Carmarthen on club nights to deliver coaching workshops using our own athletes.

I have contacted the schools and Trinity College offering volunteer placements for Duke of Edinburgh students and sports students.

Some of us require Child Protection and First Aid training. I have contacted CAVS enquiring about courses. There is a course running on the 28th September 10am – 4pm. Booking through CAVS. Are there are other routes, such as the Council, that we could access training through, as this training may not be convenient for everyone. It is a requirement for working with children that we have up to date training.

Child Protection

This was brought up during the meeting that volunteers and coaches need DBS checked accordingly to Welsh Athletics (who is due and when renewed?) Andrew will check on the list to see who needs updating. It is expected that volunteers attend every 3 years which costs £30 (Harriers Pay) Hilary Jones will be contacted by Hayley to arrange. Coaching, judging and first aid courses are also available. It was pointed out that Hedydd and Joan were the Welfare Officers.

Jane finished off by wishing to tender her resignation as Coaching Coordinator. Jane has done a great job and has written to. This was briefly brought up due to time but no replacement has yet been made (discussion at next meeting)

Sale of Refreshments in 2017

Edward Morgan was again thanked for his tireless work with the sale of refreshments during the summer season at the Carmarthen athletics track.

Fund Raising

The Harriers have been involved in Tesco Bag Packing and Raffle activities in the past. It was suggested that if the club had enough volunteers on the day to take it on, we could do the catering and selling drinks at the Gwent League in Pembrey. Tesco Bag Packing is also a possibility towards Christmas time.

Use of Carmarthen Athletics Track Equipment

Jake prepared a paper circulated to the committee members by e-mail stating a draft policy. Starting blocks was the topic in discussion. He commented that borrowing the blocks is a start to introducing under 13 athletes especially to using them ahead of major competitions. He also suggested that a book was used to book equipment out and coaches are responsible to make sure that they are brought back.

The end proposal was to take it outside of the meeting to discuss and understand the full roles/what part does everyone play. Jake and Neil will resolve and agree on a policy relating to starting blocks and re-visit. The starting blocks have now been stored in the back room of the main cabin, where they can be accessed easier at all times. The outside shed has been cleared up and now has new shelving and more space to store equipment tidily

Gwent League

Neil reported that the Gwent League was a great success back in March and that it would re-visit Pembrey Country Park on Sunday 3rd December this year. As before, he has asked for volunteers to come forward to ensure that the day goes smoothly marshals etc. Helpers would also be needed to help set up and set down the course. More information will come in the next few months and the league gets underway.

- Hedydd raised the main points taken from the two Competition review meetings held in Cardiff over the last few months. It is proposed that the Louise Arthur League will reduce from four matches to three next year, rotating events in the process. This is an ongoing process. It was suggested that the club could put on a club championships at the track but this will be discussed at a later stage. The problem with continued lack of officials was brought up too.

Let's Run Group Carmarthen:

- Jake commented on the new senior social group that had begun in Carmarthen. Many have now started social running and aiming close to 3 hour time marathons in the near future. This is a group supported by Run 4 Wales and it was suggested as a group to join up with Carmarthen Harriers which has been agreed. They currently have 300 members on Facebook page and up to 40/50 regular runners every week meeting in the layby near the school before going off on a road run. Jake met with the leader Andrea and promoted the club. At the time of writing, up to 25 athletes wish to join which could see them compete in the Gwent League for example. They will have "give it a go" sessions at the club, starting next Tuesday (26th September). They will then go for a road run. The group has been given membership forms which are half price for this time of the year. Jake asked the committee and others in the club to make them feel welcome and encourage as a few feel nervous thinking of an "athletics club". This new opportunity should see the senior and vets team developed within the club and social media. Action: Andrew has offered to help in any way and a good stage to meet new people in the region. He would happily have a chat with anyone, including Jake.
