Minutes of previous AGM held on 5th February 2014

The minutes were accepted as a true record.

Matters arising from the minutes

Portacabin: This is still the property of the council, the leaking roof has had a partial repair but the ceiling is now sagging and will need attention at some point. A close eye is to be kept on the tidiness of the cabin by Helen, Joan and Edward. There is also a problem with the lock on the equipment room door which will need attention.

Buses: This continues to be an underused but expensive item.

Website: Nathan Jones is now in sole charge of this resource which he maintains and runs to a very high standard with up to date information always available.

Membership Numbers: This remains stable and at a similar number to last year.

Volunteers: This remains a big problem despite the effort put into resolving the situation by Ivor Hopkins.

Refreshments: No refreshments are currently on offer from the cabin on training nights.

Stand: The work on the stand should now be completed by the end of February 2015. This date has moved several times already.

Chairmans Report: Although numbers competing continue to be lower than in the past the club has achieved some very good results over the last year. This is due to the commitment of coaches and volunteers who should be thanked for their hard work.

The enrolment process still needs to be reviewed and improved to try to ensure that members clearly understand that the club needs active competitors if it is to continue to thrive. Although the numbers of members in the club is stable the numbers competing are not as high as they should be. This results in an overall lowering of standards as there are not enough coaches to allow for the raising of standards with enthusiastic athletes and also catering for those who are using the club only as a keep fit option.

The membership form needs to be updated to include email and mobile phone details and an induction meeting must be arranged so that all club members and parents/carers are aware of both the opportunities they have and the responsibilities that this involves. Many E-mail addresses that have been provided are unreadable and therefore useless.

The good structure that the club enjoys with the cross country teams is not reflected across all areas of sporting activity for the club. This is an issue that needs addressing.

Treasurer Report: Thanks go to David Roberts for his work in preparing the audited report. Hedydd presented and explained the report to the meeting and are unchanged from that presented at the last general meeting.

The account balance at present is £49,332. The biggest commitment is the £11,500 towards the costs of the stand repairs although a number of contributions have been received towards this which has resulted in a good financial deal for the club overall.

A review of the bursary awards criteria is to be undertaken. This new initiative introduced two years ago has been appreciated by athletes but if it is to evolve in an equitable way that ensures fairness to all athletes it needs to be have clearly defined criteria. Carol Jones will prepare a report for the next general committee meeting to discuss. The results will be shared with athletes.

23 year old Dewi who lives at home on the family farm and is coached by Kevin Evans President of Carmarthen Harriers and trains regularly at the Carmarthen Athletics Track

He has had many injuries and illnesses in recent years but has fought back to fulfill his potential

In July last year he suffered a stress fracture of the ankle in the Commonwealth Games and for four months was unable to train at all let alone put any weight on his foot

In the UK inter counties cross country championships Dewi won the under 15 championship in Nottingham in 2006 and as a senior athlete finished 8th in 2012, 78th in 2013, 3rd in 2014 and 2nd in 2015. In this year's event he was second to Andrew Burchard the Scottish champion but finished one place ahead of Charlie Hulson the English champion

Dewi started his athletics career at Llanfynydd primary school. He took part in the Carmarthenshire primary schools cross country championships but was considered not to be good enough to be entered for the Dyfed primary schools championships

He joined Carmarthen Harriers at the age of 11 and for many years was a faithful member of the club and achieved considerable success as a junior athlete

Educated at Tregib secondary school in Llandeilo and at Swansea University where he graduated with a maths degree

In his first race in the Welsh schools cross country championships he finished 14th but then went on to win the Welsh schools cross country championships on five consecutive occasions

Dewi is the only athlete to have represented Great Britain junior teams in three different categories, cross country, track, cross country and mountain running

Welsh Road Relays Championships at Pontypridd on Sunday 22 March 2015

Carmarthen Harriers Athletics Club had another successful day at the 2015 Welsh Road Relay Championships at Ynysangharad Park in Pontypridd

On a beautiful sunny day, 37 athletes made the journey east to Pontypridd, hoping to produce more good results for the West Wales club after their recent achievements at the Gwent League, Welsh Championship and school competitions. In total there were 28 medals won, 10 gold, 13 silver and 5 bronze and the club won two team events, two second, third, fourth and sixth.

It was another exciting battle between the top clubs in Wales, held again in Pontypridd instead of Llandow race circuit. The course was flat, which was a lap around the perimeter of the Ynysangharad Park path with an extension loop in the middle for some.

Primary Schools / Novice Races were held before the main championship, run as a straight race of 1450m rather than a relay. In the first race, the U11 boys, Frank Morgan crossed the line in second position (5.29) with teammate Liam Edwards just behind in third (5.34). The A team took silver medals in the team event behind Cardiff Archers (15 points) with Ethan Richardson finishing in 10th as the third scorer for the 1st team (5.47). 4 more Harriers members competed in this event in the B team with Rhufon Phillips in 16th (6.04) Steffan Davies 25th (6.49) George Condon 26th (6.49) and Bryn Peters in 33rd (7.35) ensuring they finished a good 7th.

There were also two athletes on the podium in the Novice Girls race, with Phoebe Davis and Daisy Thompson dominating once again. Whilst Phoebe won the Dyfed Primary Schools event earlier in the week, Daisy won gold this time (5.21) with Phoebe winning silver (5.38). The scoring was completed by Ella Davis (7.13) in 24th, which gave them the bronze medals in the team competition with 27 points.

There were strong performances from the Under 13, 15 and 17 relay teams throughout the afternoon.

The Under 13 boys A team ran a superb race to win their event for the second year in a row and retain the title. Archi Morgan started off well to put them in a favourable position passing over in second place (6.07). Gareth Thompson took the team into first during the first section of his 1.8km leg (6.10). Tomos Rees on the third leg kept them ahead from the rest of the field (6.03) and Iwan Glynn, recently selected to represent Welsh Schools at the London Mini Marathon, finished the job off in style with a strong run (6.00) to win by 19 seconds from second place in 24.20. The four finished in the top eight with the fastest legs, Iwan 4th, Tomos 5th, Archi 6th and Gareth 8th.

The B & C teams also did very well finishing with Deian Morgan on 1st leg (6.54), Bedwyr Thomas (6.40), Rhodri Peters (7.05) and Joseff Rhys-Ellis (6.43) scoring well to finish 7th not far behind the A teams. There were 11 teams in the race and Cian Roberts ran on the first leg of the C team.

The Under 15 boys, running 3 legs of 2.9km with the U17 age groups, just missed out on team medals finishing in 4th position with a combined time of 30.56. Thomas Jones, who ran the 1st leg, had the second quickest time with (9.35). Wil Thompson, Iestyn Williams and Trystan Leech (running in the B team) battled well with times of (11.14, 10.07 and 10.44) respectively.

After finishing in bronze medal position in 2014, Carmarthen's second team win of the day came from the U17 men, who were far in front from start to finish. They won the team event by over a minute. Ryan Jenkins led the way (9.23) with Dwayne Griffiths running second (9.42) and Ashraf Liles, also called up to the Mini Marathon in April, winning the event. His time of 8.55 was the quickest of the race, Ryan in second and Dwayne eighth.

The Harriers' U13 and U15 Girls also performed well against strong opposition. The U13G finished in 6th with Maddie Morgan (6.53), Eva Edwards (7.17), Megan Jones (7.27) and Taylor McArthur (7.07) the four scorers. The U13 age groups also ran with the U15 Girls age group. Carmarthen Harriers' U15G won silver team medals in this age group with a time of 27.44. The scorers were Ellie Kiff (6.34), Elin Jones (7.28), Cerys Davies (7.11) and Sioned Glynn (6.31). Ellen Hawkins ran the first leg of the B team.

Once again, more medals were won through the fastest legs. Sioned was second and Ellie third.

Finally, Sian Bradshaw and Sharon Leech competed in the MW 45 category. There was only one team entered with 3 runners, but both of the Harriers' times was good and quick enough for first and second (fastest leg)

SIAB SCHOOL INTERNATIONAL – DUBLIN on Saturday 21 March 2015

Under the guidance of team managers Dai Gatehouse, Meredith Richards, Joan Goldsmith and Carol Jones along with WSAA Dai Williams, thirty two Welsh athletes and teams of eight boys and girls competed over the junior and middle age group categories at this annual cross country event featuring Wales, England, Ireland and Scotland.

U15 Carmarthen athlete Ben Thomas was selected to represent the Welsh Schools cross country team at the SIAB Schools International at Dublin, an event that has previously been held at Dinefwr Park in Llandeilo back in March 2013. The course was largely flat and fast with good underfoot conditions. In a high quality field, Ben finished in 19th position with a time of 13.56. He was the second Welshman home. England dominated throughout, winning the four age groups.
