## **Carmarthen Harriers Athletics Team Honours Board**

It is an honour to have been the chairman of Carmarthen and District Harriers Athletics Club for a period of 37 years (1981 – 2018) and to have been one of its team managers at pretty well all its inter club matches.

This report is a tribute to the very many hundreds of Carmarthen Harriers athletes I have been involved with and travelled thousands of miles with in Harriers team coaches to matches all over Wales and England in the last forty years.

Inter club competition has been and should still be the base of all clubs. Athletes train in order to compete and there is nothing better than being a member of an athletics club on the day of a League match.

I have not been a person to keep a personal diary and therefore in this report have relied on my Carmarthen Harriers Annual Reports to put together as comprehensively as possible a record of the Carmarthen Harriers team results in its many inter club competitions.

I have no records of the excellent Kate Williams and Young Glamorgan Athletes Leagues that were so popular in the 1980's and 1990's.

Carmarthen Harriers had a very good and successful senior teams in the 1970's with many outstanding Welsh international members.

In the period 1994 to 2009 the Carmarthen Harriers junior team (11-20) was pretty well unbeatable in Wales and in that period the Club won the Welsh Junior (11-20) League Cup Final sixteen times in seventeen years.

This event was held in the middle August at the end of a very busy inter club season. Carmarthen would every year qualify for the Final by finishing in the top two positions of the West Junior (11-20) League (3 matches). The Welsh Cup Final would be a key match for the Harriers team. We would always have a full team of 75 members with reserves on standby.it was run like a military operation with the Harriers team travelling to Brecon or other venues in two coaches, one for the boys and one for the girls.

In the same period Carmarthen Harriers competed in the UK Midlands Young Athletes League (11-17) Division One or Premier League.

Many of our U20 members, both male and female were medalists at Welsh schools and Welsh championships and regular members of Dyfed schools , West Wales inter regional and Welsh teams

Sadly, both Leagues came to end. The excellent Welsh Junior League (11-20) ended in 2009 when a new Welsh Junior (9-15) League replaced it. The proposal for the new Welsh Junior (9-15) League went to a vote at a meeting at Rhayader and it was voted in by seven votes to six with the Hereford Club supporting the proposal. This resulted in four fewer junior (11-20) inter club matches in Wales as the new Welsh Junior (9-15) League effectively replaced the old Louise Arthur (9-15) and South East Wales (9-17) Leagues.

In the last ten years Carmarthen Harriers has had many fewer U17 and U20 members as there has been far fewer competitions for them and the opportunity to compete for Carmarthen Harriers in inter club events.

Carmarthen Harriers has been fortunate in the last 30 years to have had annual Carmarthenshire and Dyfed primary schools indoor sportshall athletics, cross country and athletics championships with up to 4000 Dyfed primary school pupils taking part each year in the competitions organised by Hedydd Davies on behalf of Carmarthen Harriers.

Not only have these events been an introduction to the sport of athletics but an invaluable source for Dyfed secondary schools (winners of the Welsh schools overall inter district team cup 28 times since 1980) and Carmarthen and District Harriers Athletics Club and other Dyfed athletics clubs.

At present there are no definite plans to hold these primary school events in the future. It will be a sad day if these events disappear as have so many other athletics and cross country competitions in Wales in the last 10 years.

There are proposals now for a new Welsh inter regional athletics championship and Welsh under 15 junior development competition. Both involve fewer competitors and a reduced programme. Welsh Athletics will not be involved as much in these new competitions as they were with the old ones

The Covid-19 pandemic of the last two years has had an enormous effect on all sport.

Youngsters will now become more involved in other sports like football and rugby as Wales are now doing very well in these two sports.

I am now too old to be an active administrator or organiser in Welsh athletics in 2022.
